Coffee Filter Leaves

Explore the colours of the Fall season as you use them to decorate your own leaves made from coffee filters.



- Materials:**
- Coffee Filters
 - Markers
 - Spray Bottle
 - Water
 - Pencil
 - Leaf Template/Fallen Leaves
 - Scissors
 - String
 - Tape/Glue

Use washable markers in Fall colours to cover your coffee filters with colour.

1. Start with one colour at a time and add it in blotches all over your coffee filter.
2. Change colours and cover other sections
3. Continue until your whole coffee filter is covered in colours.
getting bigger as you go!

Note: Be sure to put a piece of paper under your coffee filter as you colour so the colour doesn't bleed onto your table!

Step Two: Spray
Fill your spray bottle with water and on a counter, spray your coloured coffee filters several times with water and watch the colours bleed into one another.
Once sprayed, set your coffee filters aside to dry.



Step Three: Cut & Hang
Use either the leaf templates provided or leaves you found on your nature walk to trace leaf shapes onto your dried coffee filters.
Once drawn, use scissors to cut them out.
If you'd like, you can attach your leaves to a piece of string using tape or glue and turn them into a beautiful Fall garland to hang somewhere in your home and celebrate the season.
