

Snowboarder Collage

Step-by-Step Instructions

Have you been spending more time outdoors this winter than normal? Maybe you have been enjoying some outdoor sports. Pictured here is a painting called “Pond Inlet” by Doris McCarthy from the PAMA Art Collection. Do you notice the snowy mountains? Create your own art inspired by winter sports and the scenes of a snowy winter.

Materials: Scrap Paper/Magazines, Pencil, Markers, Wooden Stick (Dowel/Popsicle Stick/Chopstick), Tape/Glue, Scissors



1. Make Your Background

Collect scrap paper and images from magazines. Collage the images together by gluing them onto a piece of paper. You can also draw your background.



2. Make your Snowboarder

On a separate piece of paper, draw a person snowboarding – maybe make it a self-portrait! Once complete, colour it in and cut out the image. Attach a stick to the back of it.



3. Put it Together

Cut a small slit through the centre of your collage. Then, put your snowboarder through the hole. Now you can move your snowboarder around on your winter scene! If you'd like, finish it off with some cotton pads or balls for the snow.
