


At Home Scavenger Hunt




It's time for an indoor recess break!

5 red objects




A story you can relate to

A photo of someone you love




A book that teaches you a lesson

Visual Book Report

Choose one of the books that you found on your scavenger hunt or find a different one that you want to read. You can also find a book online. Using the objects you found on your scavenger hunt and any art supplies you have available, create a visual display of the book you read. Try creating a different image for each chapter, a poster explaining what the book was about or a diorama. Use your imagination!

Curate Your Own Mini Museum

When you visit a museum, you will see different exhibits. An exhibit is a presentation of art or objects. Make your own mini museum exhibit at home using objects found on your scavenger hunt.

- Step 1: Choose a theme for your exhibit. For example, the theme can be “all about me”, “animals”, “my favourite movies” or “colours”.
- Step 2: Arrange your objects. Maybe you want to arrange them by theme, in chronological order (a timeline) or in alphabetical order.
- Step 3: Write labels for your objects. On each label, write the title of the object and a short description about what it is.
- Step 4: Make a title for your exhibit. Under your title, write a few sentences explaining what the exhibit is about.
- Step 5: Take pictures of your brand new exhibit and share them with @visitpama! We can't wait to see what you come up with.
