Fall Leaf Creatures

Use your imagination and bring nature to life as you create characters from leaves.



Materials:

- Construction Paper
- Pencil
- Fall Leaves/Stencils
- Scissors
- Pipe Cleaner
- White Glue
- Markers



This activity is provided to you by:

Step 1:

Go on a nature walk outside to find fallen Fall leaves that you can use as inspiration for your artwork.



Step 2:

Use your found leaves or the templates provided to trace the leaf shapes onto different colours of construction paper.

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Step 3:
Once drawn, use your scissors
to cut-out your leaf shapes.

Step 4:
Use markers/pencil crayons/crayons to draw different faces on each leaf.



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Step 5:

Use your scissors to cut pipe cleaners to different lengths for the arms and legs of your creatures.



Step 6:

Attach the pipe cleaner pieces to the back of your leaf. Hold them in place for long enough to allow the glue to dry. Once dry, move the arms and legs into different positions to give your creatures their own personalities.
