Geometric Windsocks

Printmaking, patterns and wind combine as you create your own geometric windsocks using STEAM.



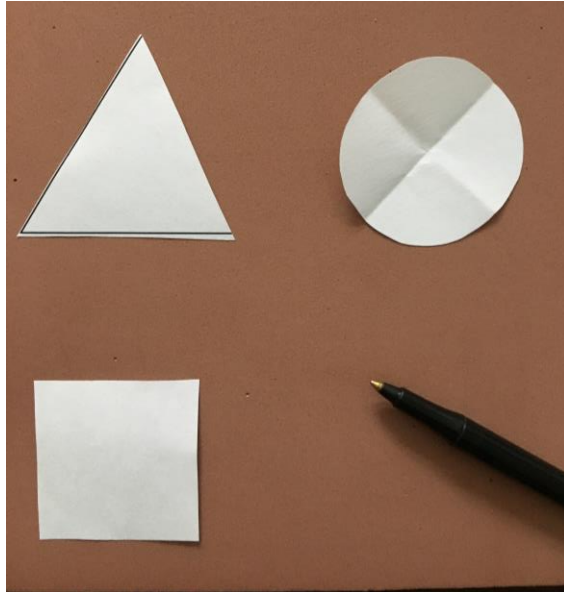
Materials:

- White Paper
- Fun Foam
- Cardboard
- Scissors
- Glue
- Paintbrush
- Paint
- Paper Plate
- Tissue Paper
- Tape/Stapler
- Hole punch
- String

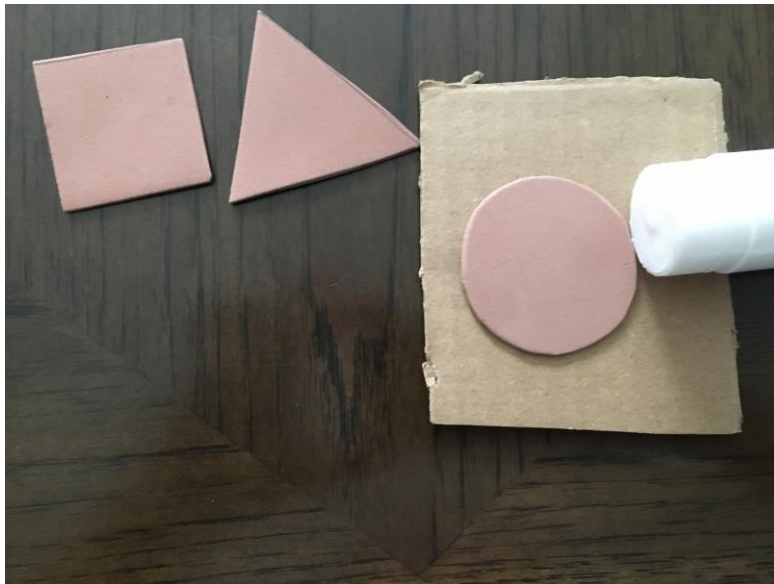
Step 1:

Trace your desired shapes onto a piece of fun foam. Pen is easiest to draw on fun foam with.



Step 2:

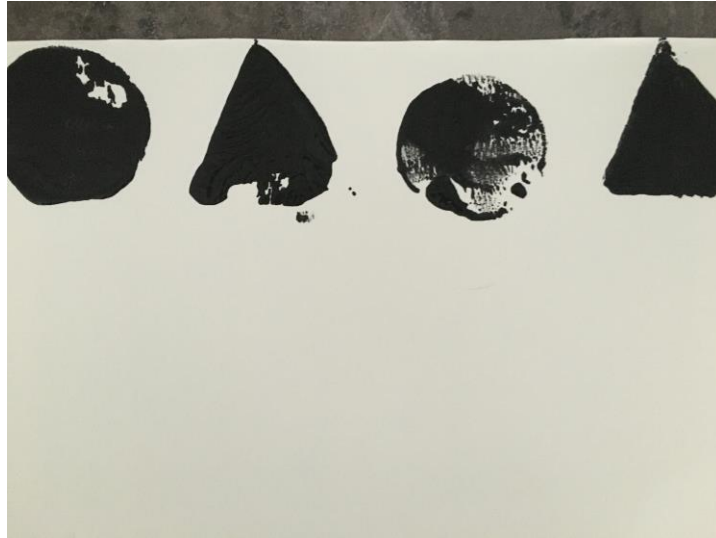
Once your shapes are traced, use scissors to cut them out and glue your shapes onto a piece of cardboard. Decide on the pattern of shapes you will use for your artwork – circle, triangle, circle etc.



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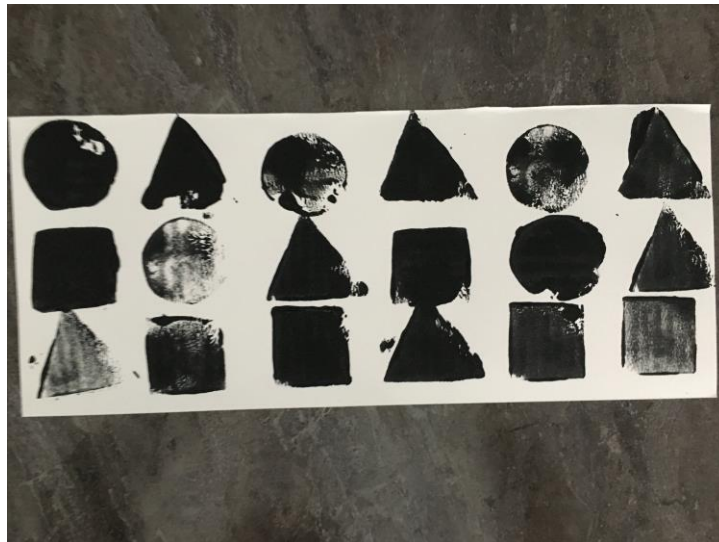
Step 3:

Gently dip your shapes in paint (or use a paintbrush to apply a thin layer on top) and press onto your piece of paper repeating your chosen pattern.



Step 4:

Continue stamping your pattern on your paper until it is covered.



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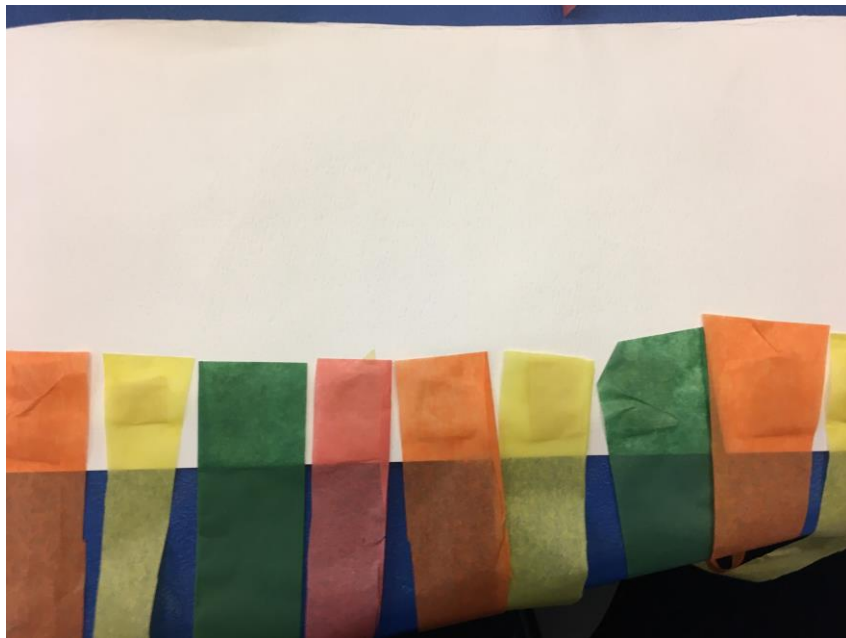
Step 5:

Set your paper aside to dry. While you wait, cut your tissue paper into long strips.



Step 6:

Once your paper is dry, use tape to attach your cut streamers to the bottom of your paper.

Step 7:

Gently roll your paper into a cylinder shape and use tape or a stapler to hold it in place.



Step 8:

Using a hole punch, punch 2 holes in the top of your windsock and feed your string through tying a knot to keep it in place.

Find a spot outside to hang your finished windsock and watch the wind blow from west to east as the days go by.
