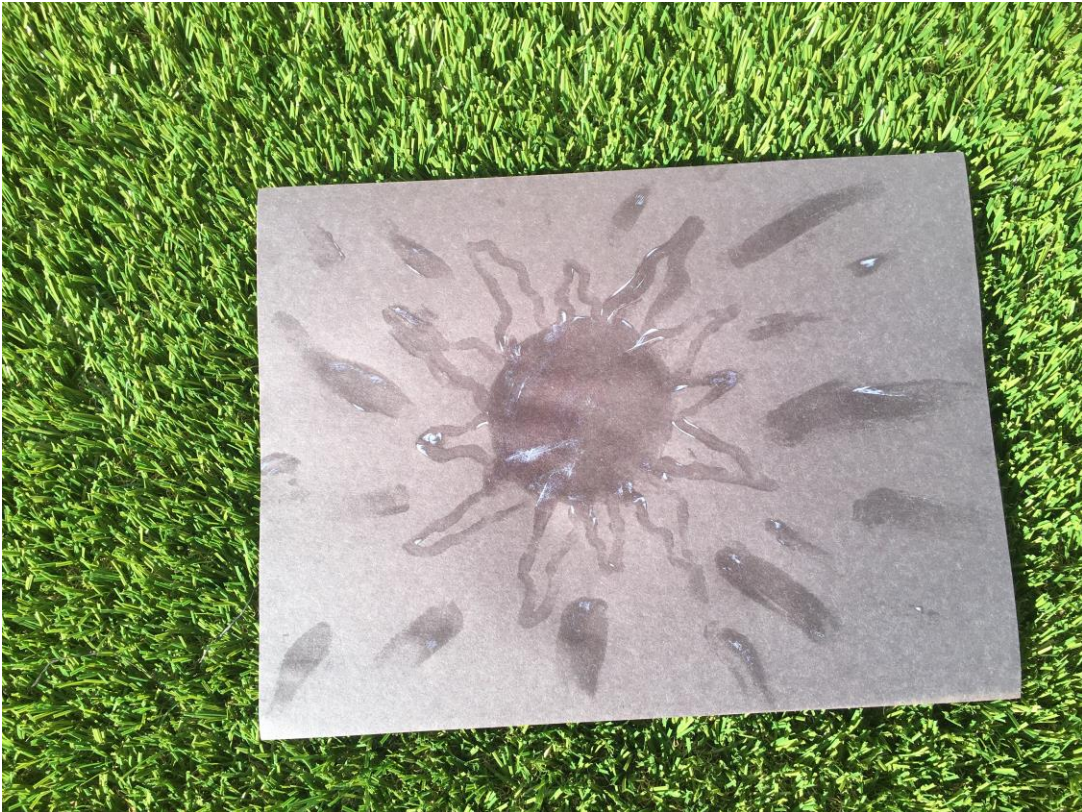
Sunscreen Painting

Sunscreen Painting

We all know how important sunscreen is to keep us safe from the sun, but it's hard to understand without seeing for ourselves. Create your own sunscreen painting and watch what sunscreen does to protect us over time.



Materials:

- Dark construction Paper
- Sunscreen
- Q-Tip/Paintbrush
- Palette/Paper Plate

This activity is provided to you by:

Step 1:

Pour a little sunscreen onto your palette/paper plate.



Step 2:

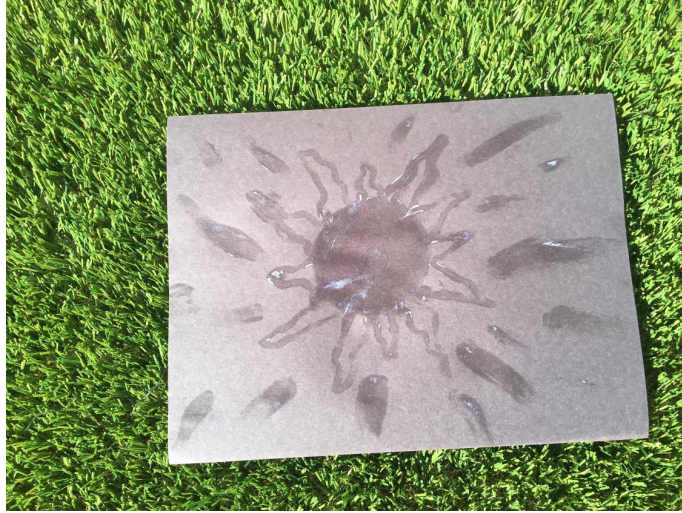
Use your q-tip/paintbrush to paint an image with sunscreen on your piece of construction paper. Be sure to leave some spots without “paint” on them, they will be important for the experimental part of this project.



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Step 3:

Once you are finished with your painting, find a sunny spot outside to set it to dry. Leave it and check to see how it's changing occasionally, over 2h.



Step 4:

When you collect your finished product, you will see that the area you painted, looks more like the original piece of paper than the area that wasn't painted. As you can see the unpainted area is quite faded, and sunscreen protected the paper from getting damaged by the sun.



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
