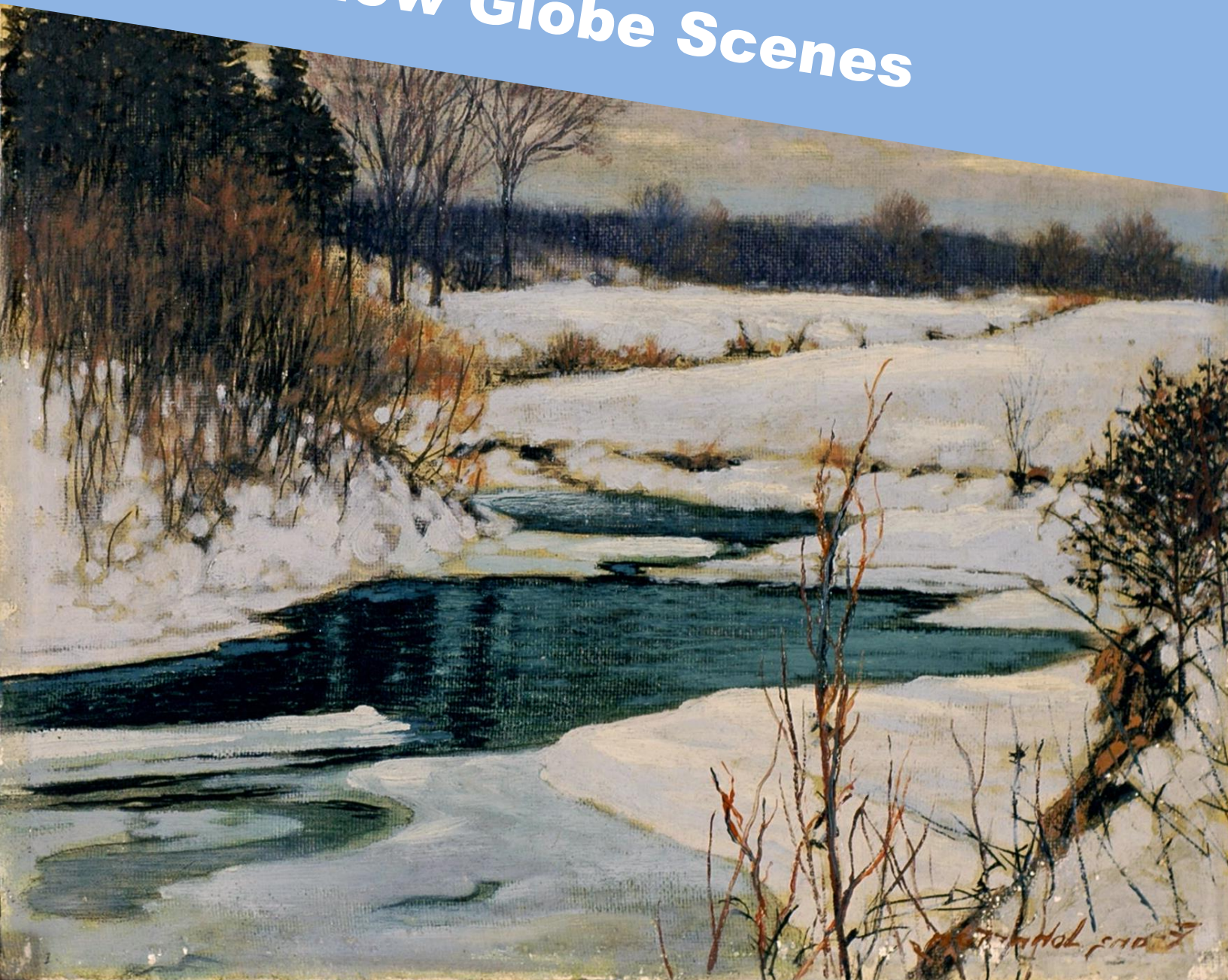

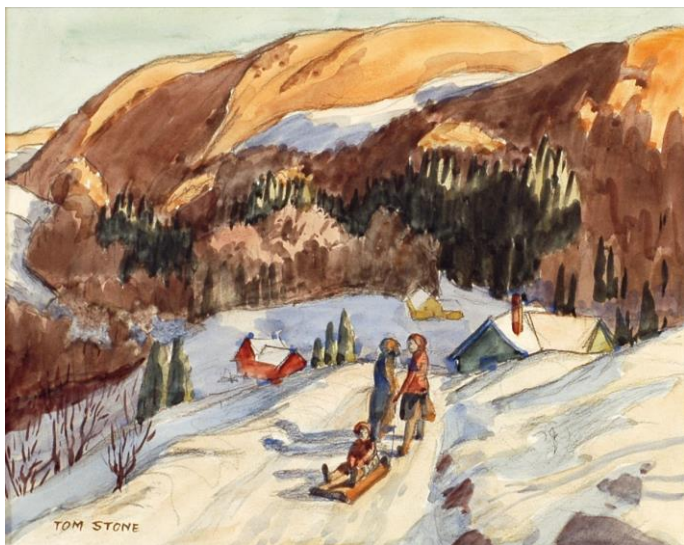

Use your imagination or your local landscape to get inspired and create your own snow globe winter scene.

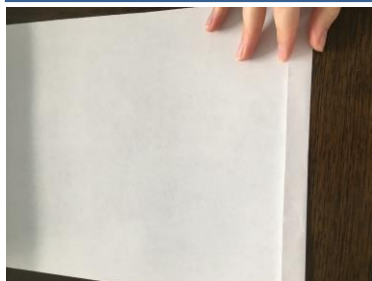
Materials:

- White Paper
- Construction Paper
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Glue Stick
- Markers/Pencil Crayons

Step One:

Fold your white paper like an accordion from the bottom upwards until you've reached about 3/4 of the way up.

Then, fold your paper in half horizontally and glue both edges together.

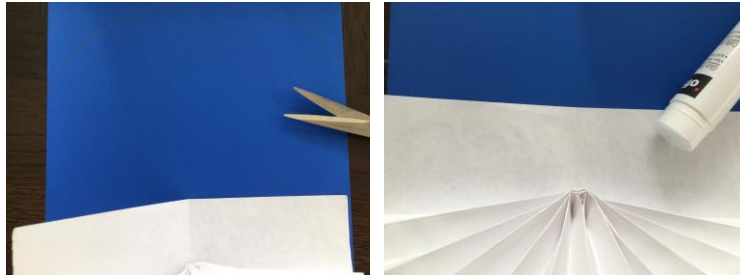

Step Two:

Cut a coloured piece of construction paper to the width of your white paper in a semi-circular shape.

Create the background by using a glue stick to attach your coloured piece of construction paper to the remaining 1/4 of your white paper.



Step Three:

Create trees, houses or snow people with other colours of construction paper and decorate them with markers.



Step Four:

Glue your finished pieces onto your background and onto your white paper to complete your snow globe scenes.
