Brampton Pastime Passports, 1883-1905, Wm. Perkins Bull fonds

- These season tickets and subscriber badges for sports teams and sports associations active in Brampton were collected by prominent Brampton citizen, politician, and businessman, Thomas W. Duggan.
- They were given to Peel historian Wm. Perkins Bull likely in the 1930s. At that time Bull was working on a history of sports in Peel, work that was eventually published as “From rattlesnake hunt to hockey: the history of sports in Canada and the sportsmen of Peel, 1798 to 1934.”
- The vast majority of the items are season tickets for the Brampton Excelsior’s Lacrosse Club, but there is also one for a “foot-ball” club (likely soccer) and two subscriber’s badges for the Brampton Amateur Athletic Association.
- This sort of material is exceedingly rare because most people throw away ticket stubs and receipts without a second thought (we refer to such material as *ephemera*).


Step 1:
