

Fall Harvest

Materials:


- Cardboard/Cardstock/Paper Plate
- Markers/Pencil Crayons/Crayons
- Brown Yarn/Twine
- Hole Punch
- Construction Paper
- Scissors
- Glue Stick
- Templates



Step 1:

Cut your cardboard/cardstock into your desired shape for the base of your activity. Use markers/pencil crayons/crayons to decorate it so approx. half looks like it's under ground and half showing the sky.





Step 2:

Take your hole punch and punch holes around the edge of your base on the half that is decorated like it's under ground.





Step 3:

Tie the end of your string/twine to the first hole and weave across your plate from side to side until the whole underground part of your base is covered in string/twine.

Step 4:

Either cut-out and use the templates provided to trace your chosen vegetables on coloured construction paper and cut them out. Use a glue stick to attach pieces of a different colour to one another and if desired, decorate with markers/pencil crayons/crayons.





Step 5:

If you want, you can do some research on the vegetables you've made and write some fun facts on the back before sliding your vegetables into your woven garden.
