




From light to dark and every shade in between, you can further your exploration of line, shape and colour as you create your own graphic gradient masterpiece.

Materials:


- Paper
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Pencil Crayons



Step 1: Use your ruler to draw the graphic pattern of your choosing.




Step 2: Continue until your whole page is covered with your pattern.






Step 3:


Select the shades of colours that you would like to use. An example would be light green, green, teal, light blue, blue, dark blue and purple. You can use as many or as few colours as you would like.



Step 4:

Starting with one end of your colour spectrum, colour-in your graphic pattern. You can press harder to get a darker colour or more lightly to get a lighter version of the same colours.







Step 5:Continue moving through your spectrum of colours and back until your whole sheet is covered with a gradient of colour through your graphic pattern.
