Boo-tiful Magic

Use crayons and paint to create a magical Halloween postcard!

Materials: Paper (cut into the size of a postcard, use cardstock if it will go in the mail), Wax Crayons, Black Acrylic Paint, Paintbrush, Carving Tool (like a toothpick)

1. Colour

Colour the whole paper with crayons. You can use any colours except black – black will not show up when you carve in your design. Press hard so that the colours show up nice and bright.



2. Paint

Use a paintbrush to paint over the drawing with black acrylic paint. Let the paint dry before going to step 3.



3. Carve

Use a toothpick or similar tool to carve your design. Gently draw using the toothpick on top of the paint. The toothpick will scrape away the paint and your design will show through from the colours underneath. What Halloween images will you include? Ghosts, witches, pumpkins, bats or cats? Get creative with whatever you choose!
