# Haunted Paper Lanterns

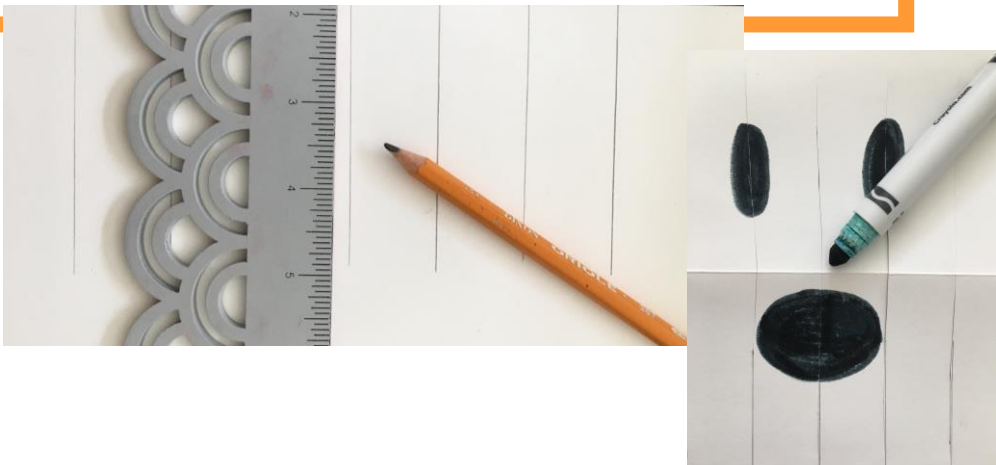
Get into the Halloween Spirit with your own spooky haunted paper lanterns.

- Materials:**
- Construction Paper
  - Stapler
  - Glue Stick
  - Ruler
  - Scissors
  - Pencil Crayons/ Markers/ Crayons
  - Electric Tealights

## Step One: Start Your Base

Fold your sheet of paper in half horizontally.

Starting on the folded edge, use your ruler to draw lines approx. 1 inch apart leaving ½ an inch from either edge of the paper.



## Step Two: Character Creation

Turn your paper vertically and draw the features of your desired characters on your paper.

You can also use other pieces of construction paper and glue them on.

This activity is provided to you by:

### Step Three: Cut & Shape

Re-fold your paper along the horizontal line and cut along your drawn lines.

Gently unfold your paper and roll it into a cylinder shape using your stapler to attach the two edges of the paper at the top and bottom.

You can use an extra small strip of paper to add a handle to the top of your lanterns.



### Step Three: Light Them Up!

Wait until it's dark and sit an electric tealight in the middle and watch your haunted lanterns glow.
