Ice Landscapes

Bring your canvas to life with an ice landscape painting!

Materials: Canvas (or heavy paper), Acrylic Paint, Water, Paintbrush, Plastic Wrap

1. Paint

Paint the background, covering the entire space using dark colours. Leave to dry.



2. Make "Ice"

Make sure your plastic wrap is ready – you'll want to cut a piece that's a bit bigger than your painting surface. Add a little bit of water to white paint. Quickly paint on top of your background with the watered-down white paint. Before the paint dries, place the plastic wrap on top of the paint.



3. Create the Ice Texture

Before the white paint dries, use your hand to add wrinkles and shapes in the plastic. Once your plastic wrap is in place, leave it to dry. When it's completely dry, you can carefully peel off the plastic to reveal your ice landscape.
