

# Hockey Masks

Make a mask as unique as you are!



The exhibition [We Are Hockey](#) is on now at PAMA until April 30<sup>th</sup> and centres on the experiences of people of colour in the sport. It highlights the historic and persistent racial inequalities in the game while celebrating the successes of some of the world's best players. In this activity, you will make a hockey mask and decorate it with your favorite colors and patterns.

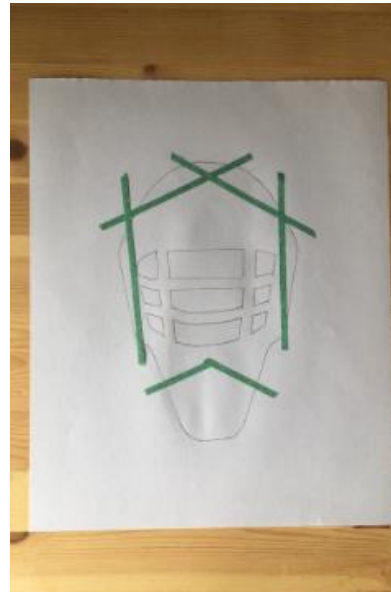
## Materials:

- Mask template
- Watercolour/heavy paper
- Watercolour paints
- Brush
- Scissors
- Q-tips
- Mini tapes

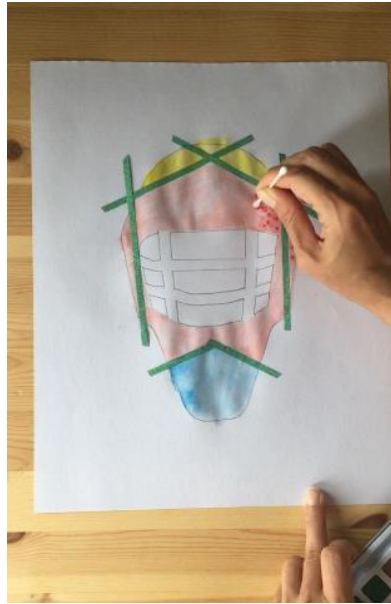
- 1. Optional:** Before you start, you can transfer the template to watercolour paper if you want to work on thicker paper.

Use the mini tape to create a pattern on the template. You can make a horizontal, vertical, or diagonal pattern, symmetrical or asymmetrical. You can even apply the tape randomly.

- 2.** Apply your favourite colour to different areas with watercolour and a brush. Choose lighter colours at this stage.



3. Create a dotted texture with Q-tips and watercolour or lines in whatever pattern you like. Think about the combination of two layers of color. Now remove the tape and cut out the mask. (You can fold the paper gently to start cutting out the smaller areas)



**Optional:** if you have an elastic band, you can wear the mask. Measure the elastic to make sure that it fits you and attach it to the mask by making a hole and tying a knot at the end of the cord.
